A Taste of Judaism

Temple Emanuel is happy once again to offer A Taste of Judaism. Who might care for a taste?

- Temple members who aren't Jewish.
- Temple members whose Jewish education is now a distant memory from childhood.
- Likewise for non-members in the South Hills and beyond.
- Singles or couples.
- And as proposed by our Union for Reform Judaism, the sponsor of A Taste of Judaism, for the "curious."

A Taste of Judaism consists of three one-hour-plus sessions. Each session is equal parts instruction and conversation, question and answer, engagement and connection. The menu includes Jewish ethics and spirituality, sprinkled with some Jewish rituals and practices. Torah is so rich, exciting the palate in diverse ways, that it will be our appetizer for our first session and dessert for our last.

A Taste of Judaism will begin at 7 pm, served at -

- Panera's meeting room in the Galleria on May 12.
- Pavilion #1 at Mt. Lebanon Main Park on May 19.
- Temple, indoors or out, depending on the weather on May 26.

May 26 will be the pièce de résistance. On the Jewish calendar, it is Lag B'Omer when it is traditional to have a *Kum Zizt*, "Come Sit," around a campfire. So weather permitting, we will have A *Taste of Judaism* "al fresco!"

Dealing with Death in the Family

Judaism teaches that the death of a loved one merits as much consideration and devotion as any sacred moment in life. Because it is easier to learn these Jewish traditions and practices objectively rather subjectively when facing the death of a loved one, Dr. Mary Cothran and I are presenting a workshop, Dealing with Death in the Family, on Sunday, May 1, from 10:30 to noon. In addition to her career as a nurse, Dr. Cothran is a member of Pittsburgh's Reform Chevra Kaddisha. Together, Mary and I will handle this sensitive topic with all the consideration and devotion that Judaism offers.

Jesus The Jew

Rabbi Mahler's presentation reconstructing Jesus' life from the historical perspective and from the perspective of Jewish theology [and eschatology, speculation about the events of the "End of Days"] that prevailed in Judea in the first century of the Common Era. Rabbi Mahler has given this presentation in churches as often as he has given it here at Temple Emanuel.

Do a Mitzvah! Help Homeless Families!!

Family Promise of Southwestern Pennsylvania connects homeless children and their families with a network of local congregations and dedicated staff who provide shelter, meals, hospitality and support until they are able to return to sustainable independent lives in their own homes. Over 40% of the homeless population is made up of families. Many shelters do not accept entire families and they have few options.

This community based program has a Day Center in Crafton which is their address of residence and base of operations for finding employment and permanent housing. Families have access to shower, laundry facilities, as well as childcare at the center. A fulltime caseworker is also there to provide assistance. The average stay for a family is 48 days and roughly 70% of them successfully return to sustainable housing.

The evening shelter and meals are provided by a network of host congregations. Each host congregation is assigned up to five weeks throughout the year. These host congregations are assisted by the support congregations. All events take place at Bower Hill Community Church.

Temple Emanuel is excited to support Bower Hill

BHCC is responsible for four weeks during the year and Temple Emanuel has the following days: April 26, June 21, September 20 and December 27. We may wish to consider taking December 25 as a Mitzvah Day project. There will be training prior to the volunteer dates.





As you come to Temple, you see the unique brick pathway which starts at Temple's front plaza on Bower Hill Road and winds beside the sidewalk to the courtyard entrance. From Iris Harlan, ECDC Director



Learning to crawl at six months — and ready to leap!

For six months we have been enjoying the benefits of our five-year grant, the Jewish Early Childhood Education Initiative (JECEI), a program supported by the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh.

Here are a few activities that are underway due to our JECEI grant:

- In March three of us attended a conference at the Cyert Center, the early childhood program of Carnegie Mellon University, where we had opportunity to observe classes in session.
- In April two of us will attend a three day seminar in Washington DC where we will visit five Reggioinspired Jewish preschools.
- In April the entire staff will have a guided tour of the Cyert Center.
- Also in April we will have a Passover workshop with Gabe Goldman, JECEI Consultant and Jewish Experiential Educator.

As a result of such opportunities, there is a great deal of dialogue at ECDC about curriculum. It is wonderful to hear the constant chatter and conversation – these all amount to collaboration.

Collaboration is in fact the most basic objective of JECEI. Where there is collaboration, there is dynamic exchange and engagement. The curriculum is not top-down and preset. Rather a reciprocal relationship evolves where the children respond to the teachers and the teachers respond to the children. Magical things happen when the teachers support the connections that the children make. For example, the children in Mrs. Silverman's Transition class were fascinated by the books of Peter H. Reynolds. After doing art in his style, they decided to make their own book and send it to the artist/author. (We are waiting for his response.) Now the children are each making their own books. It's a joy just to read the "dedication pages," again patterned after Mr. Reynolds.

You may see more examples of our collaborative curriculum along the corridors where our teachers post photographs and explanations. You will be surprised by the breadth and depth of learning. You will see that we are going from a crawl to a running leap. We are most grateful to the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh and the family of Martha Klein-Lottman for funding these far-reaching endeavors.

Many of you may not know that the architect of the original part of our building was a man named Percival Goodman. We now have a book in the library, **Percival Goodman: architect, planner, teacher, painter** edited by Kimberly J. Elman and Angela Giral . Percival Goodman was born in 1904 and died in 1989. He designed many synagogues in the U.S. in the 1950's and 1960's, including Temple Emanuel of South Hills. If you would like to learn more about this brilliant man, who won the Paris Prize in architecture and also taught at Columbia University, this would be a worthwhile read for you.

A nice book to read to your children and grandchildren:

A Grandma Like Yours/A Grandpa Like Yours by Andria Warmflash Rosenbaum, illustrated by Barb Bjornson. All the different names for grandmothers (bubbe, nana, etc.) and grandfathers (zayde, papa,etc.) with cute animal pictures.

An award winner:

The Hired Girl by Laura Amy Schlitz. The Association of Jewish Libraries 2016 Sydney Taylor gold medal winner in the teen category. The story is about a 14 year old girl in the year 1911, written in diary form. She leaves her home in eastern Pennsylvania and is hired by a wealthy Jewish family in Baltimore. You don't have to be a teenager to enjoy this story!

One more fascinating book:

The Marriage of Opposites by Alice Hoffman. Alice Hoffman is an author who does her research. This historical fiction is about a family living in St. Thomas in the early 1800's. What do you know about Jewish families living in the Caribbean at that time? Totally absorbing; this book is actually a biography of a famous artist and his family. If you don't know who this renowned impressionist is, I guess you'll need to read the book to find out!

As we approach the holiday of Passover, don't forget that we have a sample copy of about 35 different haggadot. So if you are looking to purchase a new haggadah for your seder, stop by, browse, peruse and then decide what you want to buy. 
