## To Jerusalem

This month, Alice and I leave for Israel to spend a month in Jerusalem. This will be my fourteenth trip to Israel, and my longest stint in Israel since my first year of rabbinic school at Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion in 1973-74. As that year unfolded, I sensed that I was living the most impactful year of my life. The many ensuing decades since have confirmed this sense.

As for the dozen visits that followed that first year, they were relatively brief, ranging from ten-day Temple missions to five-day rabbinic conferences. The prospect of now spending an entire month in Jerusalem pleases me to no end.

Ten of the days, I will be attending the Rabbinic Torah Study Seminar at the Shalom Hartman Institute. The founder of the Hartman Institute was Rabbi David Hartman, with whom I studied philosophy at Hebrew University that first year in Jerusalem. Rabbi Hartman was one of my special teachers who shaped and inspired me as a rabbi. Since its inception, the RTS Seminar has attracted some two-hundred rabbis annually from across the Jewish world. Several of my colleagues and friends have attended, some summer after summer, and all have encouraged me, badgered and pleaded with me to attend. *Shehecheyanu v'kiyamanu* ... the time has finally come! Alice also will be joining me at evening sessions and *Tiyul*, "Study Trek" at the RTS.

For the rest of our time there, our Israeli friends and Jerusalem's many enchantments will keep Alice and me well-occupied. But well we know that Jerusalem and Israel can be more than enchanting. Our last visit there leading Temple's 2014 Israel Mission, rockets from Gaza flashed across the sky. Thank God and Israeli ingenuity for the Iron Dome anti-missile system that kept us safe. Undaunted, indeed delighted, we are looking forward to our month in Jerusalem.

And of course, I look forward to keeping you posted and telling you all about it.

## Doing Jewish? Summertime is a Great Time for That!

Ahhh... the lazy days of summer are nearly upon us! Summertime is the time meant for sleeping, hanging out with friends, being outside, going to camp, eating ... and "doing Jewish."

What?!

Yup...believe it or not, summertime is a great time to do Jewish things. And it's not as difficult as one might think. The opportunities to stay connected to Temple Emanuel and Judaism during the upcoming summer months are endless. What follows is information about what is happening here at Temple, some helpful websites, and apps worth checking out – especially as we fiddle with our phones during the long hot, lazier-than-usual days of summer that lie ahead of us. Check it out...and plan to "do Jewish" this summer.

### I. *Make an effort to celebrate Shabbat more fully.*

Beginning this month, come to Temple's outdoor sunset services on Friday evenings at 6:30 pm or our beautiful Shabbat morning services at 10:30 am on Saturday morning. Looking for a good discussion? Come to Torah study here at Temple (Saturdays, 9 am) or talk about it at home...look to <http://www.reformjudaism.org/learning/torah-study> for guidance. Take advantage of less hectic days and plan family time on Shabbat; whether hiking, biking, eating, studying (more on this in a bit!), watching movies or just enjoying each other's company, summer can be a great time to establish family Shabbat traditions. Or check out the many apps designed to help you celebrate Shabbat. II. *Catch up on your Jewish reading.* There are just so many great books to read! And many of them have Jewish themes. Visit the library here at Temple – our librarian, Paula Altschul can certainly point interested readers in the right direction! The URJ (Union of Reform Judaism) has also made some recommendations. Read *Tablet*, an online magazine, <http://www.tabletmag.com/>, *The Forward*, an online newspaper, <http://www.forward.com> or the posts of the *Jewish Telegraphic Agency*, <http://www.jta.org/> to be in the know. In the app department, there are simply too many to list here. Go to your favorite app store and search for **Jewish News** – and choose the apps for newspapers, magazines, bible translations, books, etc. that interest you.

III. *Help your kids to remember what they learned in their Torah Center classes.* Review the alef-bet with them, or (if you don't have school aged children, or even if you do!) learn it for yourself! Need materials? Don't hesitate to call the Education Office here at Temple. We are happy to provide CD-Roms, or workbooks designed for home use. Additionally, there are a few websites that can help. For starters, go to <http://www.reformjudaism.org/jewish-life/family> for ideas. And, make sure to visit <http://www.behrmanhouse.com/family> and create a family account. Once that is done, there are multiple resources that can be accessed to help with Hebrew learning and review. With a little practice, you'll be ready for our adult Hebrew class in the fall! Another great website for younger kids: <http://www.g-dcast.com/kids-families/>. For older kids, check out the videos on <http://www.g-dcast.com/>. You will be laughing so hard your kids (and you too!) won't even realize that they are learning! Additionally, look at the list of apps available at <http://www.g-dcast.com/apps/> - there is something for everyone!

The opportunities to "do Jewish" are endless\*. Don't let the summer pass you by...whatever you choose to do, however you choose to do it...once again, this summer, make the commitment to do Jewish during the next few months. You'll be glad you did!

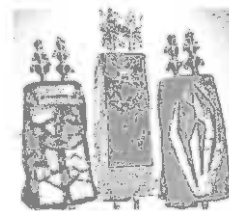

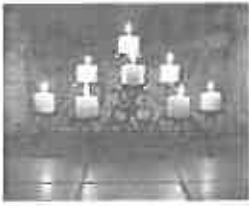

## COMING TO TERMS EIGHTH ANNIVERSARY EDITION



Temple Emanuel Retirees in Mitzvah Service (TERMS) celebrated its eighth birthday in 2017. We began with four volunteers in 2009, and have now grown to over fifteen active members.

**TERMS vision is:** *To support our Temple's needs, while enriching our own lives through the mitzvahs we perform and the friendships we develop amongst our teammates and the Temple family we serve.* The twin goals of maintaining a strong team spirit, while taking personal ownership for the mitzvahs we perform lie at the center of that vision.

Our fourth annual **TERMS Shabbat** will be held on July 29<sup>th</sup> 2017. These special services could not have been held without the active involvement of Rabbi Mahler, and many TERMS members.

Mary Cothran, chair of the **TERMS Cemetery Search Committee**, announced that Temple Emanuel purchased plots in Mt. Lebanon Cemetery. They are available to Temple members at a discount.

Our seventh annual **Memorial Day Bagel Brunch** was again held at the Upper St. Clair Recreation Center. TERMS members were on hand to ensure this event went off without a hitch. The Bagel Brunch was again free, costs defrayed by a 50/50 raffle.

Lynn and Harvey Rubin, Will Joseph, Linda Scott, and Ron Richards helped **beautify the Temple Gardens** during the past year.

Lee Feldman and Linda Scott **distributed 115 retired High Holiday Gates of Prayer Books** over the past year. They went to a Jewish senior residence, a hospital, and a nursing home.

On two separate occasions, during the past year, Carol Rose orchestrated **Meals for 40 at Miryam's Place**, a shelter for homeless women. This meal, prepared by TERMS members, owes its genesis to the Social Action Team. Carol also coordinates all the Miryam's Place meals originating at Temple Emanuel.

TERMS members supported a wide range of Temple events including the **Labor Day Picnic**, and acting as **ushers at the High Holiday Services** under Milt Wolf's capable leadership.

During the past year Ed and Roz Friedman added new materials, most of which were photographs, to the **Temple Emanuel Library Archives**. They also updated and maintained documentation describing the contents of the archives, which contain an array of materials dating from Temple's inception in 1951 to the present. They are housed in the Community Room, located next to Temple's library. This project is an ongoing effort to update and maintain Temple archives on a continuing basis.

All work and no play is no fun, so Carol and Byron Rose hosted our **Seventh Annual TERMS' Active Member Party**, a Yom Kippur break-the-fast, at their home. Roz and Ed Friedman also hosted our **2016 Summer Active Member Party**.

Where do we go from here? That's up to our **TERMS** members...old and new...and a continuing flow of new assignments for us to undertake. If the past is any indication, our future is unlimited...both in the number of active members we attract (membership is open to the men and women of Temple Emanuel who are retirees, or plan on retirement in the coming year), and the number of exciting projects we agree to undertake.

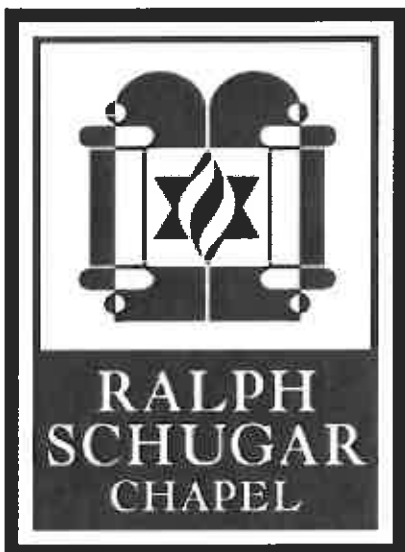
