

#### VISIT TO HARRISBURG

As you may have seen on Facebook, Rabbi Meyer went to Harrisburg last week to spend the day with PA-42 Representative Dan Miller, where he learned about PA House Bill 300.

Rabbi Meyer and nine other South Hills clergy cosigned a letter in support of PA House Bill 300, adding sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity or expression to the protected classes of race, color, creed, ancestry, age, and national origin in the 1955 Human Relations Act. Together they affirmed that all human beings are created in the Divine image and are equally deserving of protections under the law.
