### The Holocaust Memorial Garden

I am so excited and honored to share that Temple Emanuel has been awarded a grant from the **David R**. **& Frances F. Levin Charitable Foundation** for repairs and enhancements to our Memorial Holocaust Garden!

These repairs and enhancements will include replacing the dead boxwoods along the ramp, necessary touchups to the memorial stones and benches, and installing educational signs throughout the garden which will explain the symbolism of the plants and colors chosen.
