Abraham's Table: Justice

Abraham's Table seeks to promote communication, understanding, and peace among people from different religious and cultural backgrounds. Each month, a fresh thought-provoking subject will be featured, followed by engaging table conversations in which participants may share their views and viewpoints.

This initiative led by Rector Noah Evans of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Benyamin Aysan of the Turkish Cultural Center, and our own Rabbi Aaron Meyer has encouraged meaningful conversations and relationships over shared meals. It has been such a successful interfaith initiative that *We Have to Talk*, a network of over 500 interfaith spiritual leaders from across Southwestern Pennsylvania, has invited the Rector Evans, Benyamin Aysan, and Rabbi Meyer to share more about this program in a special event for the *We Have to Talk* network.

There are only two more opportunities to participate in this incredible interfaith program, and the next *Abraham's Table* dinner is next Monday, February 26th at St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Washington Road.
