



Temple's solar panels will generate 249,356 kWh per year, offsetting 87% of Temple's annual electricity needs and bill: the equivalent of 25 average family homes!






Temple Emanuel's Future

Bal Tashchit is the mitzvah of not destroying nature; even a fruit tree in war time should be protected. In Sefer HaMitzvot, Maimonides says: "And not only trees, but whoever breaks vessels, tears clothing, wrecks that which has been built up, or wastes food in a destructive manner transgresses the commandment of Bal Tashchit."
