A MESSAGE FROM RABBI AARON MEYER

Winter has certainly arrived. With a bit of jealousy directed toward those who escaped to warmer climes, those in Pittsburgh have already seen our share of snow, wind, and bitter cold. I once heard the saying that there's no bad weather, only bad clothing...but I've come to understand there's also no bad weather when you're wrapped in a warm blanket on the couch with a good book in hand.

Reading offers so much that television and endless social-media scrolling simply can't. A book invites us to choose the content we wish to see, to wrestle with ideas and big-picture concepts, and to let our imaginations flourish: filling in gaps, hearing voices, picturing worlds, and so much more. Reading is active, thoughtful exercise for our minds, and winter is its natural season.

There has been no shortage of compelling Jewish reading lately. *Hostage* by Eli Sharabi is a difficult but deeply important book, one that demands attention and moral presence. Sarah Hurwitz's *As A Jew* wrestles with the world around us and provides an unflinching look at the effects of antisemitism. *Songs for the Brokenhearted* by Ayelet Tsabari beautifully weaves history and fiction, music and memory, into a story that stays with you long after the last page. And if you need something a bit lighter, Rachel Kadish's *The Weight of Ink* is a rich and absorbing novel that bridges centuries and asks enduring questions about text, authority, and whose voices endure.

This is far from an exhaustive list, only a few of books of interest that have recently been in my hands. I'd love to know what you are reading, both to inspire me and so that I, too, have more excuses to stay under the blanket!
